## Warner Nuzova Duo

World-renowned cellist Wendy Warner and eminent pianist Irina Nuzova are earning critical acclaim for their riveting performances as the duo Warner Nuzova. **Citizens' Presentations:**

Mr. Wilson: Town Council approved a \$55,000 funding request for the 2013 Motoring Retreat, but due to a scheduling conflict, the event is delayed until November 2013. He requested that the unexpended funds at June 30th be drawn and deposited into the Motoring Retreat bank account.

**Dr. Kenneth Oberhue**

Provided Council Members handouts related to Ordinance 2012-2, amending Article 16, Chapter 4, section 16-406, Beach Dune Walkovers. He requested that the new Council reconsider the ordinance.

**Resolutions**

Town Council unanimously approved Resolution 2013-1 to Support I-526 and Resolution 2013-2 to Support the Greenway. Both resolutions were sent to Charleston County Council.

**Glass on the Beach Discussion**

In response to requests from several individuals for special exceptions to the ordinance prohibiting the use of glass on the beach; Mayor Lipuma asked that the Environmental Committee review the ordinance and provide a recommendation to Council.

**Island Beach Services Franchise Renewal**

Under the terms of the franchise agreement with Island Beach Services the Town has the discretion to renew the agreement for two one year terms. Council voted unanimously to approve a two year renewal.

**The Greenery Contract Renewal**

The Greenery has requested a one year landscaping contract renewal. The proposed renewal contract incorporates amendments into an updated document and a \$120.00 per month increase. Council voted unanimously to approve the contract renewal.

**Arts Council Service Awards:**

Mayor Lipuma presented service award plaques to Mrs. Mary Johnson and Mr. John Labriola, both of whom resigned after their election to Town Council. He thanked each of them for their years of dedication and contributions to the Arts Council. Mr. Lipuma also thanked Mrs. Linda Morgenstein, the last recipient, who was unable to attend, for her four years of dedicated service to the Arts Council.

**Election of Mayor Pro Tempore**

Mr. John D. Labriola was unanimously elected as Mayor Pro Tempore after having received the highest number of votes during the 2012 election.

**Committee Chair/Liaison Appointments**

Mayor Lipuma reviewed the Town's Organizational Chart and announced Council member committee appointments:

**Mr. Richard "Dick" Murphy:** Public Safety Committee Chairman and liaison to the St. Johns Fire District (STJFD) and the Kiawah Island Utility (KIU).

**Lauren N. Patch:** Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) liaison, Johns Island Commission, Berkeley-Charleston-Dorchester Council of Governments and CHATS. Mr. Patch will also continue with efforts on the John's Island Greenway Project as well as other road projects.

**Mr. John D. Labriola:** Mayor Pro Tempore and Liaison to the Kiawah Island Conservancy; Chairman of the Environmental Committee and Ways and Means Committee.

**Mrs. Mary Johnson:** Arts Council and Communications Committee Chairperson and liaison for the Kiawah Property Owners Group (KPOG).

**2013 Committee Appointments:** Each of the following committees and their members were appointed or reappointed unanimously by Town Council: Arts Council; Board of Zoning Appeals; Communications; Environmental; Planning Commission; and Public Safety Committee.

**Appointment of Town Attorney**

The firm Rhoad and Rhoad, Attorneys at Law managed by Dennis and Sally Rhoad was renamed as the Town's legal counsel.

**Appointment of Municipal Court Judge**

Greg Brown has announced his resignation as Municipal Court Judge with plans to relocate to the west coast. Judge Brown has agreed to stay until a replacement is named. C. Gregory Brown was reappointed as Municipal Court Judge for a two year term.

**Appointment of Town Clerk**

Petra Reynolds was reappointed as Town Clerk with a unanimous vote of Council.

**Appointment of Town Treasurer**

Kenneth Gunnells was reappointed as Town Treasurer with a unanimous vote of Council.

**Committee Reports:**

**Mr. Murphy:** The Public Safety Committee will meet on February 6, 2013. There has not been any information received back from the Governor's office in reference to the two fire commission appointments.

**Mr. Labriola:** The Ways and Means Committee met in January and will report on the SATAX Committee membership and process.

**Environmental Committee:** The members discussed the Dune walkovers issue, and the

Evasive Plant Study done by Dr. Gramling. The committee has chosen to schedule a planning secession for the near future.

**Mrs. Johnson:** At KICA's request the Town will no longer be mailed with the Digest. The Communications Committee has recommended distributing Town Notes digitally to help defray additional mailing costs. The committee is exploring updates to the Town website for improved homeowner awareness of website tools.

**Arts Council:** Hosted a series of six successful events in January. Please see page four of Town Notes for February events.

**Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA):** No January Meeting. At the December BZA meeting two applicants requested variances to the rear setbacks due to marsh encroachment and the change in the DHEC lines. Planning Commission has prepared a code amendment to present to Council. A Public Hearing has been scheduled for February 5th at 1:30 pm.

**Mayors Report:**

Mayor Lipuma thanked the citizens of Kiawah for electing him Mayor. He thanked Mr. Greg VanDerwerker and Mrs. Fran Wermuth for their service on Council for the last two years. He also thanked Mr. Al Burnaford for his ten years of service on Council and with the Planning Commission, and for his continued support through the transition. He also thanked Mr. Steve Orban for his leadership and contributions to the Town during his ten years as Mayor and Councilmember. He thanked Town staff for the hard work during the transition. The Council Retreat was held at the Charleston Marriott on January 14th and 15th. The two day session dealt with topics including a vision and mission statement and major issues or strategies. Mayor Lipuma thanked Mr. Brain Hicks for his recently published article in the Post and Courier entitled "Kiawah is no Grinch," in which he described the charitable giving that the Town provides to Johns Island and the volunteerism from Kiawah and Seabrook residents.

**Executive Session:** Council entered into Executive Session to discuss a contractual matter with the 2005 Development Agreement and the Kiawah Island Utility. No action was taken.

**Town Seeks Municipal Court Judge**

The Town of Kiawah island is seeking a full-time resident that is willing to fulfill his civic duty by serving as the Town's Municipal Court Judge. The Town is required to appoint a municipal judge of the municipal court as required by the SC state code, section 5-7-230. Town Council will seek to appoint the next Judge on Tuesday, March 5th at 2:00 pm.

The municipal court judge sets over the municipal court, dispositions tickets or offenses, and enforces Town ordinances. An interested candidate should be familiar with Town ordinances and have past experience as an attorney or judge. Newly appointed municipal judges must complete various training programs as required by the State law. The first 2013 training session for new judges will be held in Columbia on March 18th and 19th. The next training classes will be held for a full week, March 25-29. This training session will be followed by a test one week later on Friday, April 5th. **2013 Solid Waste Holiday/Special Pickup Schedule**

Trash is collected on your street's designated day which is either Monday or Tuesday. Recycling is collected Island-wide on Wednesday. Yard debris is collected Island-wide on Thursday. Please place all containers at the curb by 8:00 am. The Town will collect solid waste weekly as outlined above with the following exceptions in recognition of national holidays and special pickups listed below:

- March:** Brown Trash & Hazardous Waste: Friday, March 1st.
- April:** Paper Shredding and Electronic Waste Collection (Date TBD. Contact Rusty at [rlameo@kiawahisland.org](mailto:rlameo@kiawahisland.org))
- June:** Brown Trash & Hazardous Waste: Friday, June 7th.
- July:** **Independence Day** – Yard Debris will be collected on Friday, July 5th. Trash will be collected on Saturday, July 6th.
- September:** Brown Trash and Hazardous Waste: Friday, September 6th. **Labor Day** – Monday's trash will be collected on Tuesday, all other service days will be moved to the following day.
- November:** **Thanksgiving** – Yard Debris will be collected on Friday, November 29th.
